Below are joining instructions for attending the forthcoming MDSG conference at the Natural History Museum in London from 6–8 January 2020.

SILLITOE WORKSHOP - MONDAY 6TH JANUARY

Those who have secured a place on the pre-conference Sillitoe Porphyry Workshop should arrive at the Earth Galleries entrance to the NHM on Exhibition Road for 09.30 am. Enter via the Departmental visitor entrance and you will be allowed through into the Earth Galleries foyer to pick up your conference badge. From there you will be guided to the workshop venue which is the Attenborough Studio, located in Darwin Centre north, on the west side of the museum.

REGISTRATION AND ICE-BREAKER RECEPTION - SPONSORED BY SRK CONSULTING - MONDAY 6TH JANUARY

The ice-breaker reception will be held from 18.00-20.15 in the Spirit Gallery, Darwin Centre north. Entry will be from the Queensgate entrance ONLY on the west side of the NHM (see map). All other public and visitor entrances will be closed. Workshop delegates can move directly from the Attenborough Studio to the adjacent Spirit Gallery at the end of the workshop. Delegates will be able to register and pick up their conference badges, which will be required for entry to the museum for the main conference sessions.

To avoid single-use plastics, we are providing specially engraved conference glassware sponsored by LODE and the Natural History Museum that will be used for the ice-breaker and for the poster session refreshments. Please keep a hold of your glass if you would like it refilled during the ice-breaker! All glasses are to be returned to the collection trays on exiting the museum and they will be washed ready for the next day. At the end of the conference, all delegates will be able to take home their own conference memento. We are extremely grateful to Sambrook's Brewery for providing heavily discounted beer and William Grant & Sons for generously supplying the gin for the event.

For those wishing to convene at a local hostelry after the ice-breaker, we have reserved the RSM Bar in Beit Quad, Imperial College, on the north side of Prince Consort Road, approximately 5 minutes' walk from the Queensgate entrance to the museum, from 20.30 (see map).

MAIN CONFERENCE - TUESDAY 7TH AND WEDNESDAY 8TH JANUARY

Entry to the museum will be possible from 08.00 on both conference days, via the Earth Galleries entrance to the NHM on Exhibition Road. Enter via the Departmental visitor entrance and you will be allowed through to the Earth Galleries foyer. Follow the signs up three flights of stairs to the Flett Lecture Theatre foyer where pre-conference coffee will be available for early arrivals. Local guides will be available to assist. Delegates who have not yet registered will be able to pick up their conference programme and badge from the registration desk in the Flett foyer. The conference

welcome and housekeeping information will be presented in the Flett Lecture Theatre at 08.50 on the first day.

All posters will be numbered, so please find the appropriate board according to the poster list in the conference programme. Posters will be displayed at one end of the Flett Foyer and in Room PA135 which is located downstairs underneath the Flett Theatre, accessed by the staircase in the Flett Foyer. The main poster session will be held from 17.00-18.30 on Tuesday 7th January and you will be expected to be standing by your poster during this period. It is also recommended that you attend your poster during the refreshments and lunch breaks.

REMINDER FOR SPEAKERS

All normal talks are 15-17 minutes plus questions and Chairs will be asked to keep speakers strictly to time, so please prepare your talk appropriately. Talks should be compatible with Powerpoint 16 in pptx format for PC and need to be uploaded from memory stick no later than the break prior to the session in which you are presenting. No individual laptops will be permitted. We recommend 16:9 wide format for presentations, although 4:3 can be used. To avoid formatting issues, either use standard fonts or embed fonts in your presentation.


